

D-Star repeater gets new cabinet and upgrades.

The Des Moines area D-Star repeater was recently upgraded and several hardware and software changes were made. Given the additional equipment that is being added a larger rack mount cabinet was obtained. This allows all the equipment to be in one location. This equipment includes the UHF and VHF digital repeaters as well as the rack mount server and controller. On the 2nd day of June, 2009, the Officers and Board of Directors of the DMRAA convened their monthly administrative meeting. All duly elected officers and board members were in attendance. In addition, Dan Miller (ACØOF), Tom Briles (KBØNFF) and John Eckard (KCØGFY) were also present. Minutes of May meeting were approved. Treasurer reported \$7,09.24 balance in account.

Items of old business discussed included:

(1) 2010 Hamfest: details still being sorted out to determine costs of having classroom at the FFA hall adjacent to the Hamfest location. Estimated Hamfest profit of \$1,211.40 (with final accounting to be provided next month)

(2) Trailer: Dan is continuing to work on necessary paperwork before trailer can be used for events

Items of new business discussed and approved included:

- (1) DMRAA members can have the option to prepay dues in three (3) year increments.
- (2) July board meeting will be held on 7/7/09 as scheduled
- (3) DMRAA subcommittee assignment circulation reviewed.
- (4) A new location for the chili feed/auction will need to be found. NØVPR will be checking for a site and reporting at the next meeting; date of event is 11/24/09
- (5) Consensus was that the Christmas party should be held in same location if possible. Date of event is 12/8/09.

KAØDOS will check with Plymouth to see if the date is available (6) Consensus was that the general meetings should also continue to be held in Plymouth. KAØDOS will also check to see if the location will continue to be available (7) D-star subcommittee need four (4) callsigns for repeaters. Approval was given for DMRAA to apply for four new callsigns (not vanity so no expense) for such use. NØVPR is listed as trustee.

The monthly meeting of the Des Moines Radio Amateurs' Association Officers and Board of Directors began at 7:00 PM. All duly elected officers and board members were in attendance, except for the absences of Board Member Dennis O'Brien (KAODØS) and Secretary Tre Critelli (KAØFRW).

The minutes from the June board meeting were approved unanimously.

The Treasurer reported a balance of \$6,573.31 in the DMRAA fund.

Field Day 2009 - Field Day 2009 was largely considered successful. While reviewing Field Day 2009, numerous improvements and changes were suggested for next year's Field Day event. Another beam would be nice, and better antenna grounding would help next year. The board will also explore the possibility of moving the Field Day location to a different spot. Suggestions were Valley West Mall, Jordan Creek Town Center (near lake area), the Statehouse, Terrace Hill, the Science Center of Iowa, parking ramp near SCI, and the Simpson Barn in Johnston. Ron will look into these and other locations. The solar power equipment worked well, and PowerFilm expressed interest in providing a "PowerShade" solar canopy that could provide up to a kilowatt of electricity next year. Reimbursements were provided to club members for items pertaining to Field Day.

Chili Feed & Auction location – The board approved St. Paul Presbyterian Church in Johnston as the location of this year's chili feed and auction.

DMRAA.com renewal – The board approved the renewal of the DMRAA.com domain for the next

five years. Both DMRAA.com and DMRAA.org will continue to point to the same server and both domains will be maintained. Tom will renew the DMRAA.com domain.

Christmas Party date – Due to scheduling difficulties with venues and meetings in the month of December, a date needs to be selected for the Christmas Party. Possible dates suggested for the party were December 7th or the 10th. Discussion was tabled until more information is gathered for the next meeting.

Invitation to host ARRL Section/ Regional Convention - The DMRAA was approached about hosting the ARRL Midwest Regional and Iowa Section convention that is currently held in Sioux City. This would be held in place of the usual DMRAA Hamfest. A larger venue would be required. More logistical planning would be required to accommodate out-of-towners, guest speakers, and vendors. Amount of readily-available manpower was also a concern. Not much other information was available. The board will speak with Iowa Section Manager Tom Brehmer (NOLOH) about the convention at July's general meeting, where Brehmer is the featured guest speaker. Discussion was tabled until more information is gathered for the next meeting.

Program subcommittee – George reported that ideas for upcoming August and September general meetings include go-kits, homebrewing, and VHF/UHF digital modes (D-STAR, APRS, Winlink, Echolink/IRLP, etc.).

Communication subcommittee – The August Static Sheet will be coming out shortly. Tom encouraged eve-

ing out shortly. Tom encouraged everyone to write an article or contribute for future editions of the Static Sheet.

Public Relations subcommittee – Tom created the Public Relations subcommittee in response to Field Day

and appointed Kevin Sanders (KØDSM) as the chairman. Numerous pictures from Field Day 2009 were submitted to the ARRL for use in QST Magazine and other publications. Press releases were sent out to over two dozen central Iowa media outlets ahead of Field Day. Tom spoke as a guest on two WHO-AM radio shows to tout the event. Des Moines hams Larry Vandewater (NØBKB), Mike Waldron (AEØMW), Jim Snapp (NAØR), George Noble (KK7FM), Bob Evans (KØIQR), and Mike McQuiston (WAØMM), Norma and Roland Newton (KCØLIN and KCØIEA) were all sources in a story about amateur radio in The Iowan magazine. Chili Feed & Auction subcommittee – The board approved St. Paul Presbyterian Church in Johnston as the location of this year's chili feed and auction.

Hamfest subcommittee – The further exploration of using the FFA building at the Iowa State Fairgrounds for testing was discussed. Rental for a half-day of the FFA building is \$250, no deposit required. Tom will sign the rental contract on behalf of the DMRAA to reserve the building unless a more suitable location is found since there is no deposit required on the FFA building. It was also suggested that the Hamfest may start later in the morning and end a bit later on.

Education subcommittee – Education committee will be working on an upcoming Boy Scout activity.

Repeater & Packet subcommittee – Dean reported that the packet systems are still up and running. A frequency guide for the packet systems will be published soon to remind members that we still have packet.
