

DMRAA Technician Classes

HOTSTUFF? NO! STOP IT!!

by KAØFTO Larry.

What HOTSTUFF? Check your power cords where they plug into the 110VAC receptacles are they warm? If so you may have one or two problems or both.

<u>Problem ONE</u> the 110VAC wall receptacle may be wired the easy way.

<u>Problem TWO</u> your molded line cord may have a crimped plug and not soldered and has become loose or the wires are frayed.

Figure 1 is a normal 3 wire 110VAC dual receptacle from the

front. LOOK BEHIND IT. HOW IS IT WIRED?

BEFORE LOOKING AT FIGURE 2 & 3 MAKE SURE YOU OPEN THE CIRCUIT AT THE CIRCUIT BREAKER BOX.

Figure 2 is the easy connection way that some Electricians use because it is faster. Less wire to receptacle contact!

Figure 3 is the better way, that is slower, but more wire to screw contact.

Figure 4 is a normal molded plug on the end of a power cord and probably is crimped not SOLDERED.

Figure 5 is a better ugly type 110VAC male end before it is placed on the end of the power cord.

Figure 6 is the completed replacement on the end of our 1000 Watt 4 slice toaster.

I have replaced all of our dual wall sock-

ets, in the kitchen, like Figure 1, and have connected them like figure 3. They were all wired like Figure 2. Using an Electric Griddle and the Toaster would cause the wall sockets to be warm to the touch. Figure 6 was our Toaster cable after replacing the molded plug that now runs cool. I always solder the end of the stranded wire so it will not fray before I connect the Male end on the cable.

ANOTHER ITEM TO BE CAREFUL OF IS MANY ELECTRICIANS WANT TO USE 14 GUAGE WIRE AND NOT 12 GUAGE. IT IS SMALLER AND EASIER TO WORK WITH. DO NOT LET THEM DO THIS. 14 GUAGE WIRE WILL NOT HANDLE AS MUCH CURRENT AS 12 GUAGE AND MAY HAVE HEAT LOSS THAT YOU ARE PAYING FOR AND IN AN EXTREME CASE COULD RESULT IN A FIRE!




