

#### Checkpoint

The club has done well in 2015. We currently have over 100 active members on the roster. We continue to provide interesting and meaningful programs. Our events have all been very well attended. A new oneday class format for license training was successful. There is money in the club account. We've implemented multiple repeaters and are working on installing more. All this success is entirely due to the efforts of those who are "pitching in". To you I offer a heartfelt "thank you, and well done".

We've added some new members due to the one-day class previously mentioned. Part of their package was a years membership in the club. We also offered those newlylicensed admission to the Chili Feed and Auction. Some of those folks turned up there and at the Christmas party! I am certain you will see some unfamiliar faces at upcoming meetings or events. Please be sure to greet and get to know this next generation of hams.

The club will be formally sponsoring ARRL VEC testing. In the past we've had sessions at the Hamfest or after a class session. Going forward, this will include the bi-monthly sessions held at Johnstone Supply. The reality of this is that we will help reimburse reasonable and customary expenses related to testing. This will not influence or change how the testing is proctored.

As a note, since the point is raised from time to time, the main reason we have implemented new repeaters is to leverage the capacity and capability of some locations which have become available to us. We are taking the opportunity to link some of these and also leverage new modes of operation. Are there quite a few repeaters in Des Moines and the surround-

ing areas? Yes there are. It's not about expanding just to increase the numbers. It is in entirely about increasing our capabilities and enhancing our preparedness in case of disaster. We never know when a disaster will take place or what will be impacted. It is incumbent on us to be prepared and have flexible locations and equipment for just such an eventuality. It is for this very reason we are licensed by the FCC. Thusly, it is also why we support ARES and the public service events which serve as preparedness drills for us. We exist to serve.

### Repeater Linking in Des Moines

There have been several upgrades lately to a couple of repeaters in Des Moines. Recently the DMRAA's second repeater at the VA Hospital, WØAK-2 146.985 was upgraded with a UHF remote base radio. This upgrade allows the repeater to be linked with any one of several local UHF repeaters in the area. Similarly the Polk County ARES repeater at Methodist Hospital KØDSM 444.100 was fitted with a VHF remote base, which allows it to be linked with any one of the local VHF repeaters.

These upgrades can be useful for various ARES supported events as recently shown for the Head of the Des Moines Rowing Regatta, and the 2015 Dam to Dam Half Marathon. With both events operators could hear all event traffic.
