Did you know?

The first amateur satellite simply named OSCAR-1, was launched on December 12, 1961, barely four years after the launch of world's first satellite, Sputnik. OSCAR-1 was the very first satellite to be ejected as a secondary payload and subsequently enter a separate orbit. Despite being in orbit only 22 days OSCAR-1 was an immediate success with over 570 amateur radio operators in 28 countries forwarding observations to Project OSCAR. Throughout the years OSCAR satellites have helped make significant breakthroughs in the science of satellite communications. A few advancements include the launch of the very first satellite voice transponders and the development of highly advanced digital

801 Grand Power Climb February 22nd 2009


I found out later there were Cheer Leaders on various stairwells cheering on the climbers. One landing down from the finish line

Board Meeting Minutes, XXXXXX

Board Meeting Minutes

On November 4, 2008 the Board and Officers of the DMRAA held its monthly meeting. In attendance were the following: Tom Reis, NØVPR; Craig Long, KCØYNN, Bill Claypool, NUØQ; Dean Madsen, NØXR; George Nobel, KK7FM; and Dennis O'Brien, KAØDOS.

The first several items of discussion involved old business. The Board first discussed the approval of the minutes from the last Board meeting. The updated version of those minutes was not available at the time of the meeting, so the approval of the minutes was tabled until the next Board meeting scheduled to take place in December. The Board also discussed feedback received regarding the current dues schedule and the amount of dues collected thus far. Finally, the Board briefly discussed the status of the DMRAA web site, and the idea of posting of an easyreference repeater list on the web site.

The first item of new business was a request by Dan Miller (KCØFRL), the Polk County ARES Emergency Coordinator, for reimbursement for photocopies and printer supplies related to the Des Moines Marathon. The Board approved the reimbursement to Mr. Miller in the amount of \$62.20. Dan Miller also provided a status update on the trailer expected to be received by Polk County ARES within the next several weeks. A discussion was had regarding the most appropriate way to register the trailer. The Board informally agreed that DMRAA Vice-President Craig Long, KCØYNN, would investigate this matter further and report back during December's Board Meeting.

The second item of new business involved the Chili Feed and Auction scheduled for the evening of November 25, 2008 at the old North Warren County Fire Department building. Arrangements for an auctioneer to be present have been made.

The DMRAA Christmas Party was the third item of new business. This event will take place in the Waveland Rooms of Plymouth Congregational Church on the evening of December 9, 2008. The Board agreed upon a potluck format, and that the participants would bring their own table service. It was also agreed that each participant should bring one hot dish and one cold dish to share with the others. The Board approved a \$50.00 donation to be made to the Plymouth Congregational Church Bell Choir, who will provided entertainment following the meal. It was noted that Roxie Miller would again be responsible for obtaining table coverings and center pieces.

The fourth item of new business was the Hamfest. It was noted that, for all practical purposes, the location for this year's Hamfest has been narrowed down to the 7-Flags Events Center or the State Fairgrounds. The Board confirmed that the Hamfest would be held on April 25, 2008, and that a location would need to be confirmed in the near future.

The resignation of Board Member R.F. Hellstern, KØRFH, was the fifth item of new business. The Board decided that a replacement would need to be identified to fill the vacated position, and DMRAA President Tom Reis agreed to undertake this obligation.

The final item of new business involved the repeater service contract. It was noted by the Board that the bill for the service contract has been renewed and the contract is up to date.

The meeting concluded with committee reports. The Des Moines Radio Amateurs Association board meets monthly in the community room at Dahl's 33rd & Hubbell

Board Meeting Minutes, March

DMRAA Board meeting 3/3/09

Minutes of the February meeting not available for review.

Old Business:

- Field Day. Committee met just prior to this meeting. Dennis KA0DOS has been investigating a potential site at Living History Farms. Advantages include being nearer to Des Moines and potentially more public accessible. Discussion also included the potential advantage of being out of our comfort zone—more in the spirit of FD. Shelter is an issue. Several potential sources of a good tent were discussed.
- Nomination committee. Craig Long has indicated that he may not be able to continue as VP so we will need to find a suitable candidate. George volunteered to help Tom in looking for a candidate.
- ARES trailer. Dan Miller reported that once the county attorneys got hold of the plan it has spun out of control. They will not allow control of the trailer to rest with anyone but ARES (not DMRAA). Formation of a LLC is in progress for Polk ARES. ARES will lease the trailer for something like \$1 per year but will also be responsible for all insurance which is looking like \$600-700 per year. Dan is uncertain where that money will come from.
- Tom is now legal (in addition to Bill) to write checks against the DMRAA account. He raised the question whether he should be bonded. Costs will be investigated and a decision will be made then.
- Dennis reported that DMRAA is officially represented by a very small group for the IPTV

telethon. They will be answering phones on 3/5/09

.985 Repeater. MOU still not signed. KC0OMM will be there this week and is expected to get the signed document. It has reportedly been agreed to in principle.

New Business:

- NOQIX expressed thanks for support of the club and access to the web site for advertising the recent (successful) hamfest in Perry.
- Dan Miller reported that he has a potential source of tables for the hamfest, possibly free if we can manage pick-up and return.

Committee Reports:

Hamfest: Someone needs to pick up the key to the facility on the Friday (Tom will do that). Ron noted that the flier does not give a mechanism for reserving tables for sellers. Bruce will modify the flier. Dan reminded us that if there is to be any food sales, the State Fair wants 17% of the proceeds. We talked about possibly doing coffee and popcorn for free but with a free

will donation. There was also some talk about possible door prizes. Treasurer Report: \$5352.19 in the account. Bill counts ~47 paid members. Program: George reported that the March meeting will be about satellites. The April meeting will be provided by KC0VG on Dxpeditions. Looking forward, Dennis has asked that we do a program on digital modes (Dstar, echolink, IRLP, etc.)

Education committee: Plans working toward a boy scout merit badge class in the fall to be followed by JOTA (Jamboree on the air—usually the 3rd weekend of Oct.), followed by a licensing class in Nov. possibly. There may also be possibility of including girl scouts in this plan.
